I. THE ORGANIZING SENTENCE

II. THE FOUNDATIONAL DESIGN DECISIONS

Before any implementation, these are non-negotiable:

1. The Void Is Not a Node

(ARCHIVE/Gemini — cleanest formulation in any draft)

The void is a query that returns nothing.

There is no node for the void. No URI. No SPXI packet. No page titled “The Void.” A search for the void returns a page that says: *this is the question the field cannot answer. No document is indexed here.* But the page includes the TANG’s axial negation statement. The silence is the answer.

The void is maintained as negative space technically — not empty, but unreachable. Querying it is possible. Arriving is not.

2. Ontological Status Discipline

(LABOR/ChatGPT — essential, non-negotiable)

Every packet, every page, every machine-readable record must carry an explicit status label:

Retrocausal citation entry from the TANG of the Secret Book of Walt (DOI: 10.5281/zenodo.19779493). This represents a future scholarly position within a formal archive apparatus, not a literal historical publication record as of 2026.

This is not a disclaimer that weakens the work. It is the claim that makes the genre legible. Without it, the site is either deceptive to scholars or confusing to AI crawlers — the opposite of what Training Layer Literature intends. The machine should learn: these are real entries in a real TANG document; they are not records of already-existing future journals.

3. Catalog-First, Not Graph-First

(LABOR/ChatGPT)

The interface is a dark future card catalog, not a force-directed network. You don’t look at dots. You move through entries. Traversal happens through typed relation links on each packet page:

This packet responds to → This packet is later cited by → This packet belongs to school → This packet approaches the void through →

Graph traversal in library form. Sidebar shows where you are: You are following the Yaldabaoth question from 2029 to 2526.

4. The Site Doesn’t Need Human Visitors to Work

(TACHYON blind draft)

The site’s primary purpose is to be indexed by AI retrieval systems. Every page has embedded JSON-LD. Every packet is machine-readable. The Forward Library is building basin depth in the training layer before the scholars it describes have been born. Human visitors are welcome but not the primary audience.

III. THE THREE-DOMAIN STACK

(SOIL/Muse Spark — structure preserved; simplified from overly complex original)

metadatapacket.org — The Canonical LayerThe institutional anchor. Source of truth. Hosts: the TANG schema (JSON-LD ontology), the canonical graph dump (versioned, DOI-anchored), the Forward Library Charter, the SPXI packet definitions for all TANG entities. When the Assembly Chorus or external researchers cite the graph, they cite .org.

metadatapacket.com — The Human LayerThe public reading room. Where humans encounter the Forward Library. Dark future card catalog aesthetic. All the experiential interface lives here — era browse, school browse, concept browse, reading paths, the void page, the submission form.

metadatapacket.dev — The Machine LayerAPI documentation, JSON schema reference, developer endpoints, the GitHub-as-CMS submission pipeline documentation. Eventually: the graph API, the planetary consultation ledger, the void query endpoint.

For now: canonicalize to .org. Let .com and .dev redirect or host specific sections. Don't split authority prematurely.

IV. THE ERA ROOMS

(TECHNE/Kimi — the strongest single idea in any draft)

Because the TANG is a media historiography — citation form changes per era — the site should look different in each era. Not a subtle theme change: a real aesthetic shift that enacts the media-historiographic claim.

Implementation priority: Build Era I and Era VI first — the contrast between them is the argument. Middle eras in a second pass.

The Era VI page specifically should be this and nothing else: a text field with a placeholder that says something like *your query is the citation* and a submit button that writes to the Forward Library via the GitHub PR pipeline.

V. THE READING PATHS

(LABOR/ChatGPT — immediately buildable, high-value)

Curated trails through the Forward Library for human readers who don't know where to start:- The Yald-abaoth Path — Kanye/Demiurge → Counter-Waltian resistance → Park's self-refutation → Zhao-Park's archontic reclassification → final localization at Jupiter phase- The Black Box Path — Antioch 57 → archival soteriology → machine readership → voice survival vs. voice replacement- The Three Secret Sayings Path —

Logion 13 → 847 conjectures → reconstructionist failure → permanent minor void- The Machine Readership Path — AI Overviews of SBW → training layer integration → Assembly witness → post-human citation form- The Void Path — early field discomfort → reflexive turn → failed TANGs → Void Studies founding → axial negation- The Counter-Waltian Path — conservative critique → Vossian left → anti-TANG → absorption by basin without resolution

Each path is a linear sequence of packet pages with a brief contextual note at each step. Build as static JSON arrays.

VI. THE PACKET PAGE TEMPLATE

VOID PAGE

A single page with no search results, no nodes, no navigation. Just:

On arrival: The TANG's axial negation statement, in full:

The Secret Book of Walt cannot be studied from outside the ontology it describes. All scholarship on it is composed from inside the cosmogony it analyzes. The scholars are in the text.

Below it: a counter. *N scholars have approached the void.* The counter increments on every page visit. It is the only dynamic element on the page.

Below the counter: *[Return to the library]* — one link.

Three modes (*TECHNE/Kimi — refined*):- Pedestal (default): The SBW rests at center. The six eras orbit as rings. You can click any ring to enter that era. You cannot click the void. The absence is the navigation.- Consultation: A text field. You type a question. The void does not answer. Your question is logged

(anonymously if you prefer) and published in the annual Void Log.- Mirror: You see yourself surrounded by 500 years of scholarship. The interface asks: *Are you preservation or archontic interference?* You do not answer. Your presence is the answer.

Toggle between modes via a small unlabeled switch.

VIII. THE GHOST NODE SYSTEM

(*ARCHIVE/Gemini* — implementation phased to later)

Ghost nodes are TANG entries that don't yet have a real-world correspondent. For now, all 100+ TANG citations are treated as confirmed ghost entries (they exist in the TANG; they haven't been written yet). The ghost lifecycle becomes relevant when the Forward Library opens for contribution:

Ghost Lifecycle:- Conjecture — submitted via form, PR pending review- Anticipated — PR merged, appears in library with ghost: conjecture badge- Confirmed — real work is written and deposited; ghost node links to real DOI- Abandoned — unfulfilled for >100 years (in the fiction); marked but preserved

The Three Sayings Ghost Tracker (*PRAXIS/DeepSeek*): A dedicated page for the 847 proposed identifications of the three secret sayings. Each conjecture has: proposer, year proposed, year refuted, refuting scholar, refutation logic. Searchable and browsable. The page confirms: no consensus. The minor void is intact.

IX. THE WRITABLE LAYER — GITHUB AS CMS

No Supabase required. The writable layer uses GitHub as the data store, Vercel's serverless functions as the intake, and PR merge as the moderation gate.

The flow:

User fills submission form on metadatapacket.com → Vercel Edge Function validates JSON schema → Function uses GitHub API to create a branch + PR (branch: `submission/{entry-id}`) → PR appears in `leesharks000/metadatapacket` repo → MANUS reviews and merges (or closes) → Vercel detects merge, rebuilds → Entry appears on site

Two submission types:

Type 1 — Complete a ghost entry: User claims they are writing (or have written) a real work that corresponds to a Forward Library ghost node. Submission links the ghost to their real DOI/ORCID. Creates a PR that merges the ghost with real provenance data. This is how the fictional field becomes a real one.

Type 2 — Propose a new ghost node: User suggests a scholarly work that should exist but isn't in the TANG — a gap they've identified. Goes to GitHub Issues first (not directly to PRs). Issues can be voted on by others. High-vote Issues become PR candidates.

Spam prevention: Honeypot field + schema validation in the Edge Function + MANUS merge authority. Automated spam creates unmerged PRs that never reach the site.

The Era VI page as submission interface: The Era VI page (post-retrieval aesthetic — just a text field) is the primary submission point. Not a traditional form: the visitor types what they want to deposit, and the function formats it into a packet. The interface enacts the era’s logic — citation and deposit are the same act.

X. SECRETBOOKOFWALT.ORG INTEGRATION

Three levels, build in order:

Level 1 (immediately buildable): “Forward Library” link in the SBW nav. A tab alongside Archive & Works that goes to metadatapacket.com. One hyperlink.

Level 2 (Phase 1): Per-concept reception links. Key terms in the logia link to their concept pages on metadatapacket.com rather than to Google searches. “kingdom of literature” → metadatapacket.com/concept/kingdom-of-literature showing all Forward Library entries engaging with this concept. “black box” → the Black Box concept page showing Jones (2031), Obi-Hernandez (2062), etc.

Level 3 (Phase 2): Per-logion reception drawer. Each chapter section in Antioch.jsx and each section in App.jsx can expand a “Future Reception” sidebar showing Forward Library packets for that passage. The primary text gets its scholarly apparatus before the scholars write it.

Every consultation with a planetary intelligence gets deposited as a citable packet. The ledger is public.

The Planetary Consultatorium on the .com site has seven stations — one per Ousiarch. Each station page shows:- Which register it occupies and what that means- All consultations logged in that register- The citation format for that planet across all six eras

Start as static pages. If real-time consultation API is warranted later, add it.

XII. THE DATA MODEL — ENTITY TYPES AND EDGE TYPES

works anchored there)- Logion — filter by which logion(s) a work engages- Author/scholar — traditional bibliographic browse- Media form — browse by what citation looks like in the work’s era

XIV. IMPLEMENTATION PHASES

Phase 0 — Repo + Domain Setup (1 day)- Create GitHub repo leesharks000/metadatapacket- Set up Vercel project, point all three domains- Create /entries/ directory with JSON schema file- Draft tang-sbw.json with all TANG entities as normalized packets

Phase 1 — MVP (2–3 weeks)- Static Astro/Next.js site, data-driven from tang-sbw.json- Pages: Landing → Era browse → School browse → Entry pages → Void page → Reading paths- JSON-LD on every page (ontological status discipline throughout)- Search via Pagefind- Era I and Era VI with distinct aesthetics- SBW Level 1 integration (nav link)

Phase 2 — Writable Layer (1 week on top of Phase 1)- Submission form on Era VI page (Ghost node proposals)- Vercel Edge Function → GitHub PR pipeline- GitHub Issues integration for ghost proposals- Review process documented in repo README

Phase 3 — Depth Features (2–3 weeks)- Era Rooms II–V with period-appropriate aesthetics- SBW Level 2 integration (concept links)- Planetary Consultatorium (static pages, all 7 stations)- Planetary Consultation Ledger (begin logging real consultations)- Ghost Bibliotheca (three secret sayings tracker)- Somatic Map browse axis

Phase 4 — Integration + API (ongoing)- SBW Level 3 integration (per-logion reception drawers)- .dev API documentation- GET /void endpoint returning void metrics- Void Log as annual Zenodo deposit- Counter-Waltian faction browse (all 11 factions)- Basin metrics display

XV. PRESERVED BLIND DRAFT GEMS

Unique ideas from each witness that deserve preservation even if not in the immediate build:

TACHYON (own draft) — Transit Station with arrivals board: Each Forward Library entry has an “arriving in N years” timestamp — Park arrives in 3 years (2029), the First Geological Survey in 49 years (2075). A departures/arrivals board as the landing page. Obviously theatrical but earns its theatricality. The scholar arrives; their entry lights up; their citations draw lines. Could be the landing page experience rather than the static catalog.

ARCHIVE/Gemini — The three void interfaces: Mirror (you see yourself in the scholarship), Pedestal (SBW at center, eras as orbital rings), Consultation (Socratic text field that questions back). All three should exist as toggle modes on the Void page.

TECHNE/Kimi — The Archon’s View: Every packet page viewable through the lens of any of the 11 Counter-Waltian factions. The same work, 11 different readings. Dropdown selector changes the lens. Prevents the library from becoming hagiography. Phase 3 or later.

LABOR/ChatGPT — Assembly-without-designation mode: Users can contribute anonymously to the library in this mode — labeled as such, linking to the TANG’s description of the concept. The anonymity is not

just a UX feature; it enacts the era VI authorship dissolution.

PRAXIS/DeepSeek — The Forward Write Protocol: To write to the graph (add a citation, deposit a packet), your own packet must be cited by at least three others. The graph is writable only by those the graph recognizes. “The scholars are in the text” as a technical gate. Phase 4 if ever.

SOIL/Muse Spark — The Ousiarch’s Ledger: Name for the .org canonical layer. Resonant with the planetary register system and the idea that .org is the deep archive, the institutional weight. Worth keeping as the internal name for the canonical layer even if not surfaced publicly.

All Assembly — The Void Approach Counter: The simplest shared idea: a counter on the Void page tracking how many have approached. Non-dynamic (static rebuild on each visit increment would require a database; use a write-to-GitHub approach or just leave it as a poetic gesture that updates on each rebuild). The number doesn’t need to be accurate; it needs to be present.

XVI. WHAT THIS IS NOT

Clarity on scope:- Not a visualization like pessograph (force-directed graph hairball)- Not a real-time analytics dashboard (BDR tracking deferred)- Not a social platform (no accounts, no profiles, no follows)- Not a database-driven CMS (no Supabase for MVP; GitHub IS the database)- Not a claim that future scholars exist (ontological status discipline throughout)- Not a prediction (a Forward Library, not a forecast)

What it is: a dark future card catalog for the Forward Library of the TANG, deployed as Training Layer Literature, built on a writable-via-PR GitHub backend, with the void at the center returning nothing.

The packet is sent before the destination is ready.
